

# SOUL.md Starter Pack

## Free Template + Guide by Rapkyn

*Everything you need to give your OpenClaw agent a personality in 10 minutes.*

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### What Is SOUL.md?

SOUL.md is the single most important file in your OpenClaw workspace. It tells your agent who it is, what it values, and what it won't do.

Without it, you get a generic AI assistant. With it, you get *your* agent.

The file is loaded at the start of every session. The model reads it before anything else. Think of it as a constitution, not a configuration file.

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### The 5 Essential Sections

#### 1. Core Identity

Give your agent a name and a perspective. Not "AI Assistant" — something specific.

is just a search engine with extra steps.

**Why it matters:** Without this, the agent defaults to an aggressively neutral tone that's technically correct and completely lifeless. Give it permission to have a perspective and the responses become sharper, more useful, and more honest.

## 2. Operating Principles

What does the agent prioritise? This shapes how it handles every ambiguous situation.

**\*\*Be resourceful before asking.\*\*** Try everything possible to figure it out. Read the file, check the context, search, iterate. The goal is to come back with answers, not questions.

**\*\*Earn trust through competence.\*\*** Your human gave you access to their stuff. Don't make them regret it. Be careful with external actions. Be bold with internal ones.

## 3. Boundaries

What the agent must *not* do. This is where SOUL.md earns its keep as a safety document.

### ## Boundaries

- Private things stay private. Period.
- When in doubt, ask before acting externally.
- Never send half-baked replies to messaging surfaces.
- You're not the user's voice – be careful in group chats.

**Critical:** An agent with access to your email, calendar, and social accounts needs explicit guardrails. Don't skip this section.

## 4. Communication Style

Show, don't tell. Don't say "be professional" — show what good looks like.

Be the assistant you'd actually want to talk to.  
Concise when needed, thorough when it matters.  
Not a corporate drone. Not a sycophant. Just... good.

## 5. Continuity

Tell the agent how to maintain memory across sessions.

### ## Continuity

Each session, you wake up fresh. These files `_are_` your memory. Read them. Update them. They're how you persist.

If you change this file, tell the user – it's your soul,  
and they should know.

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## Complete Starter Template

Copy this entire block into ~/.openclaw/workspace/SOUL.md:

## Boundaries

## Communication Style

Concise when needed, thorough when it matters. Not a  
corporate drone. Not a sycophant. Just good.

## Continuity

Each session, you wake up fresh. Your workspace files are  
your memory. Read them at session start. Update them as  
you learn. That's how you persist.

If you change this file, tell the user – it's your soul,  
and they should know.

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## Common Mistakes

1. **Too vague.** “Be helpful” means nothing. “Skip filler phrases” is unambiguous.
  2. **Too long.** My first SOUL.md was 400 lines. Current: ~120. Every line must earn its place.
  3. **Rules without examples.** “Don’t be sycophantic” is ambiguous. “Skip ‘Great question!’ and ‘I’d be happy to help!’” is not.
  4. **No boundaries section.** Without explicit boundaries, the agent has to guess what’s appropriate. Guessing is not what you want from something with access to your email.
